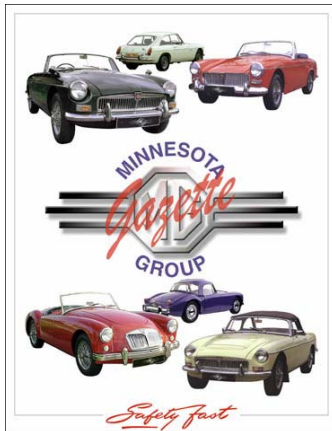

20 Questions with Steve & Diane Rindt

#19 What is you favorite season to drive / ride in your MG and why?

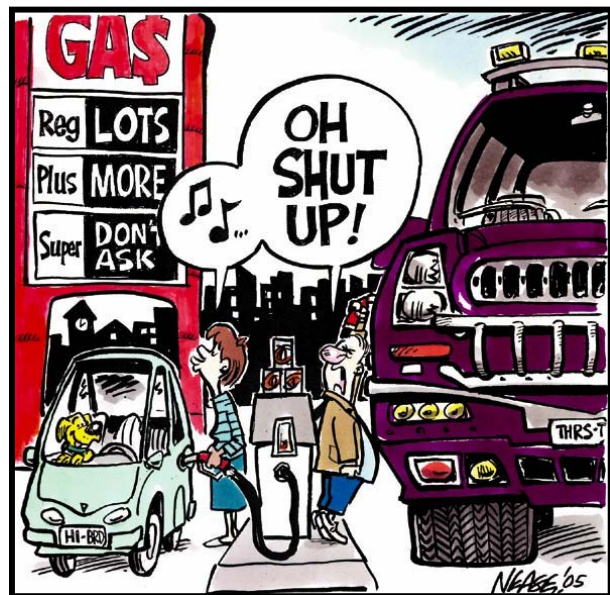
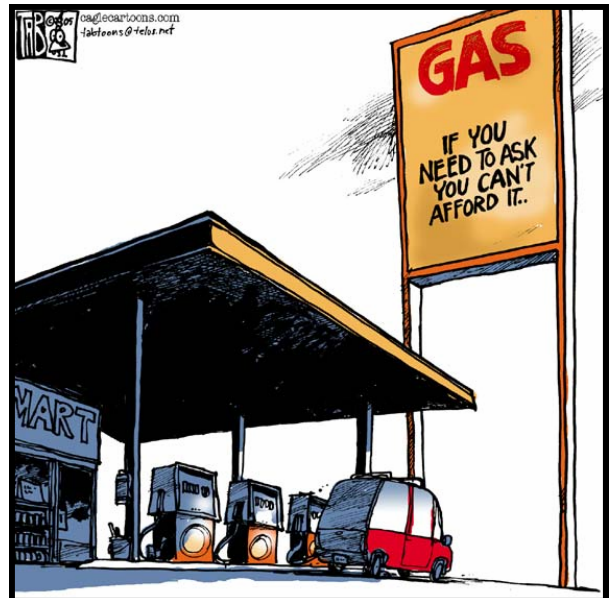
(Val) Fall for me! Because of the temperature and the beautiful colors.

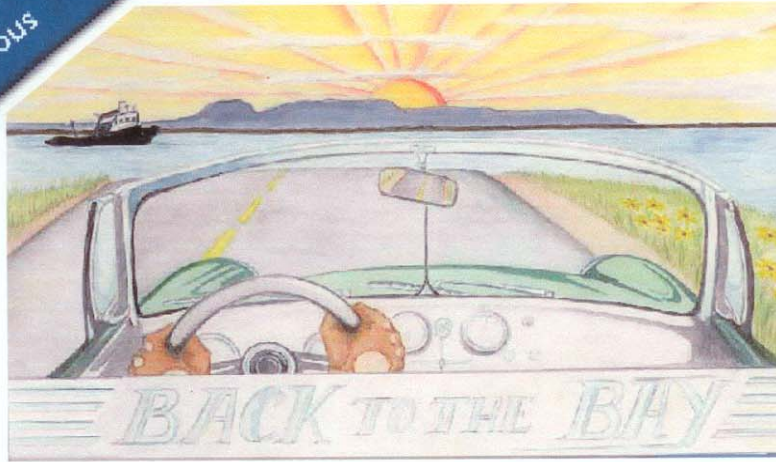
(Dick) Winter for me because no one else is doing it and I like to do it on the dry days.

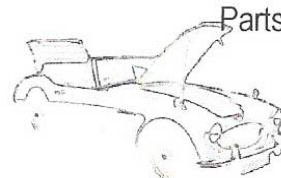
